Homework

The pupils will receive homework every week on Dojo:

- A list of spellings from our phonics lessons and some tricky words. These will be practised each Friday.
- A phonics book and a reading book
- A maths task will be posted on Dojo.
- It is important that you hear your child read daily for a minimum of 10 minutes.



History—My World, My Story

- The children will look at changes and events in their own lives

- They will look at how their grandparents' childhoods were different to their own



Geography —All About Me

- The children will use maps to identify where we are in the world
- They will find key features on aerial maps
- They will go into the local area and create simple maps with key features



Writing

- The children practice writing sentences with capital letters, full stops and finger spaces
- The children take part in a range of activities to improve letter formation and fine motor skills
- The children will use their knowledge of phonics to spell and write new words



Reading

The children will have a phonics book each week that they will read daily in small groups.


- The Cautious Caterpillar

- The children will have daily focused phonics and spelling activities with a spelling recall on Fridays.

Maths



- Place Value within 10.

- Addition and subtraction within 10.

- The human body and seasonal changes in the weather over the course of the year.

Art



- Looking at different portrait artists, the children will create their own self portrait

Computing



- The children will input instructions into a programmable toy to make it move

- The children will begin to use computer coding by using Scratch Junior

DT



- Design, make and evaluate a puppet

Music



- The children will take part in call and response songs


- They will learn and perform carols in preparation for Carols on the playground.
