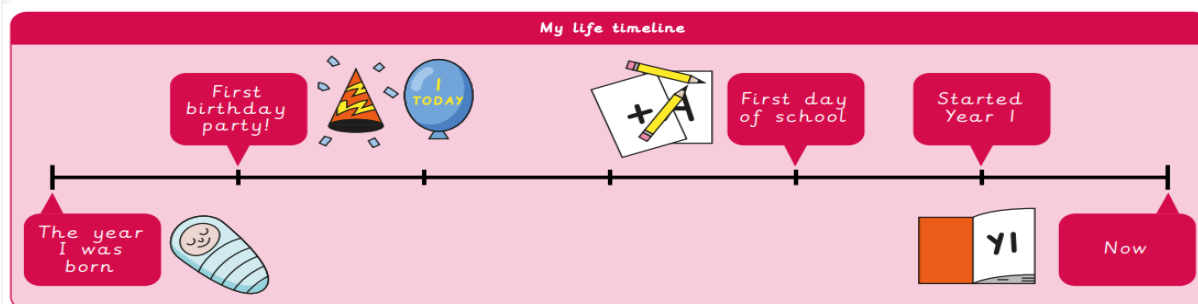
Look at and talk about old family photos.

afternoon	The part of the day after lunch	
change	When something becomes different.	
childhood	The time when you are a child.	
different	Not the same.	
evening	The part of the day when it starts to get dark.	
event	Something that happens.	
future	The time that has not happened yet.	
history	Things that happened a long time ago.	
morning	The start of the day, when you wake up.	
memory	Something you remember.	
photograph	A picture taken with a camera.	
present	What is happening now.	
past	The time that has already happened.	
similar	Almost the same.	
time	When things happen, like morning or evening.	
timeline	A line that shows events in order.
