R&W - Why doesn't Christianity always look the same?





Roman Catholicism was one of the first practising denominations of Christianity. The Pope is based in Rome as this was the centre of the Roman Empire. The first Pope (Peter, one of Jesus' disciples) is believed to have been chosen by Jesus.



Matthew, Mark, Luke and John were Jesus' early followers and recorded many of the stories about Jesus that are now found in the New Testament. These books are referred to as the Gospels.



The Christian worldview originated from Jewish beliefs and practices. Jesus was Jewish and so were his early followers. Christianity grew from differences in beliefs about Jesus as the Messiah.

Protestant the authority of the Bible, salvation through God's love

Anglican (Church of England) the authority of the Bible, liturgy and sacraments

Methodist living a good and selfless life, helping others

Lutheranism showing faith, baptism and the Eucharist

Quakers the Holy Spirit, quiet worship and peaceful lives
